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Associate Professor Ione Lewis (University of Canberra) has trained as a social worker and psychotherapist with ANZAP in the self psychological model. She is the Vice President of both SCAPE and PACFA. She has specialized in trauma therapy and has been an approved victims of crime counsellor with the NSW Attorney General's Department. She has worked extensively with victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, single event trauma (home invasions and armed robberies) and families bereaved by homicide. Ione has a long involvement in developing and teaching courses in postgraduate counsellor education and has

researched and published on the professional identity of counsellors and psychotherapists, client perceptions of counselling outcomes, violence against women and evaluation of individual/group counselling services.
